

## **VII. GROWTH INDUCING IMPACTS**

This section describes the potential growth inducing impacts the Proposed Action may have on the community or area. Listed below are factors typically affected by growth induced by a new non-residential development.

The Proposed Action by itself will not necessarily induce growth but will accommodate anticipated growth. Nevertheless the following aspects of the Town's growth are affected:

### **A. Population**

The proposed improvements will add to local purchasing power and potentially increase the Town's population if employees are attracted from outside of Montgomery and wish to live in the Town. However, the majority of jobs are anticipated to be filled by residents in the area. Some managerial transfers may take place, and these employees may have spouses and/or children accompany them.

### **B. Support Facilities**

The proposed facility could directly induce the expansion of certain facilities in the area, particularly truck servicing and office and maintenance supply businesses. The outside drivers expected at the facility will most likely utilize local truck stops and servicing stations located on County Route 99 and County Route 208.

### **C. Development Potential**

It is not anticipated that the Proposed Action will induce residential development in the area as most of the labor force will be hired locally. The Proposed Action could, however, indirectly induce the expansion of existing commercial uses as a result of the potential added earnings to local consumers. This added income may result in increased consumer spending.
